- tutorials: just copying without explanation, no explanation for why we use that particular equation
- more explanation for mathematical components please

▷ very theoretical focus → apart from data analysis, no general discussion about real world problems and how to practically solve them

▷ instructor seemed sometimes like in a bad mood (which made the atmosphere sometimes uncomfortable)

- I think there could have been more examples from the economic reality (e.g. like a case study). In that way students would have been able to apply the relevant information and deepen the knowledge further. (more than just showing a graph).
- professor was a little moody this semester
