"Economic Aspects of the Corona Pandemic"

Summer Semester 2021

Motivation:

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Since early 2020, the Corona pandemic has been dominating people's lives around the globe. The consequences affect different parts of societies and economies, and while some phenomena may be of a transitory nature, others are likely to have long-term consequences. The goal of this seminar is to diagnose past and current events and to speculate on the future: based on current research, we want to describe different aspects of the pandemic, to assess their short-run and long-run impact, and to discuss appropriate policy measures.

Participants:

The seminar is offered as a **Research Module in International Economics** to those students in the **Masters Program "International Economics and Public Policy" (MIEPP)** who chose the specialization area "**International Economics**".



Prerequisites:

We expect students to be interested in both theoretical and empirical analyses, and to be willing to retrieve and process both epidemiological and economic data.

Topics:

At the first (mandatory) meeting on April 22, 2021, we will present different topics, which will be allocated among participants through April 28. Here is a short (and non-exhaustive) list of potential topics:

- How does the Corona pandemic affect international trade?
- What are the effects of fiscal stimulus packages during a pandemic?
- How does the Corona pandemic affect the distribution of income?
- What are the specific consequences of the Corona pandemic in developing countries?
- Is there a trade-off between preserving lives and sustaining economic prosperity?
- Should Corona make us re-think the merits of a market-based economy?
- (How) will the Corona pandemic affect price stability?
- How will the Corona pandemic affect the labor market?
- What will be the long-run effect of the Corona-pandemic on productivity?
