

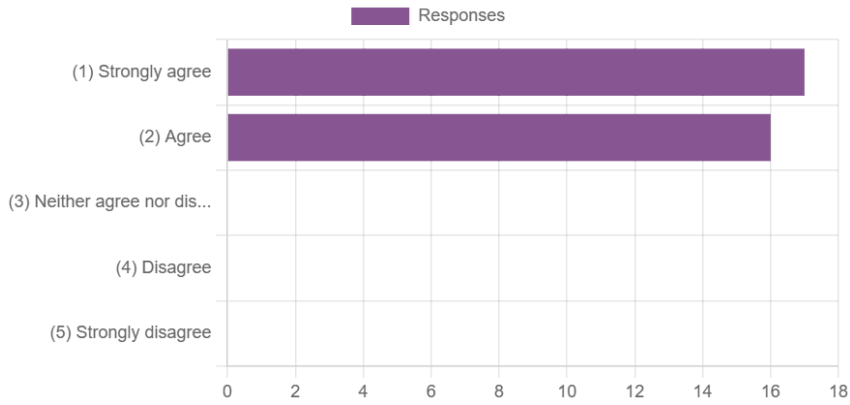

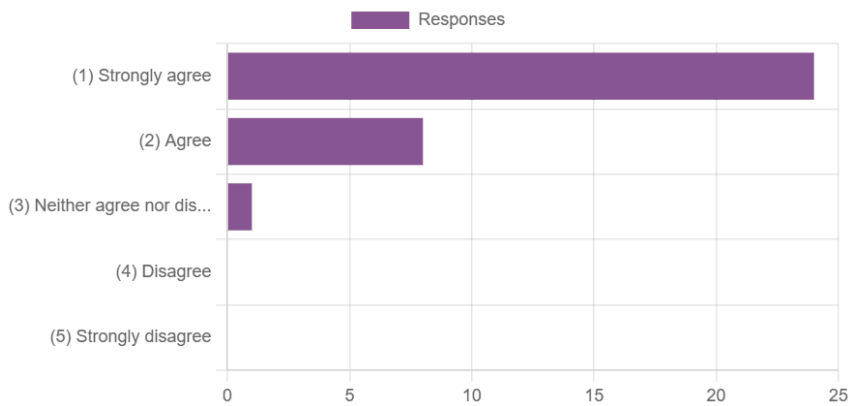
1. The lecture has endowed me with novel and important skills and insights.

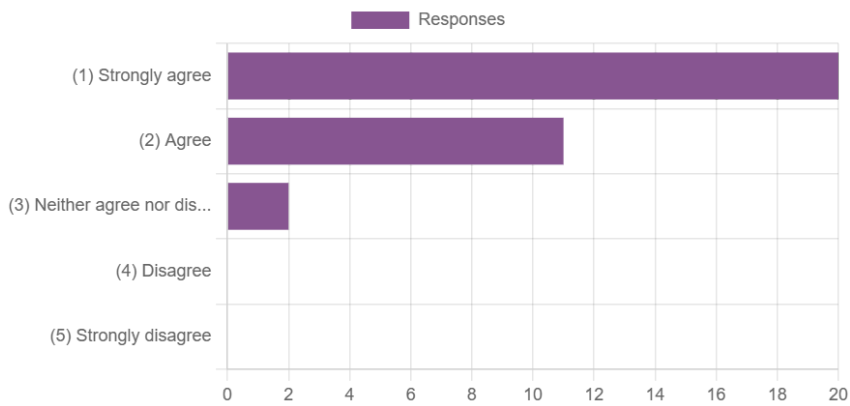
2. The lecture has helped me to better understand economic phenomena and developments.

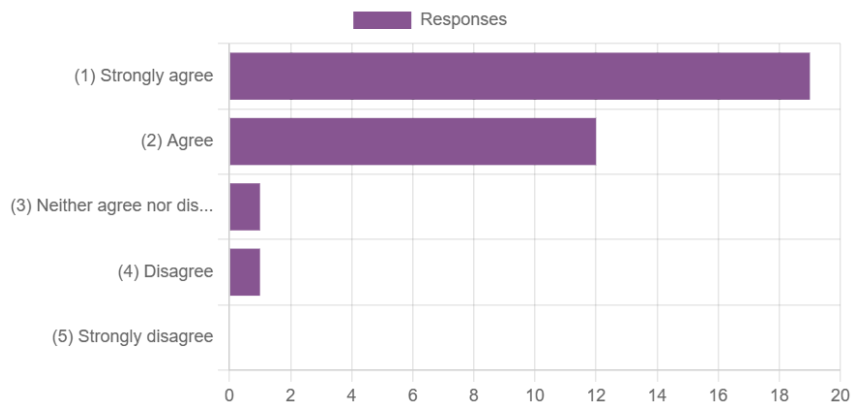

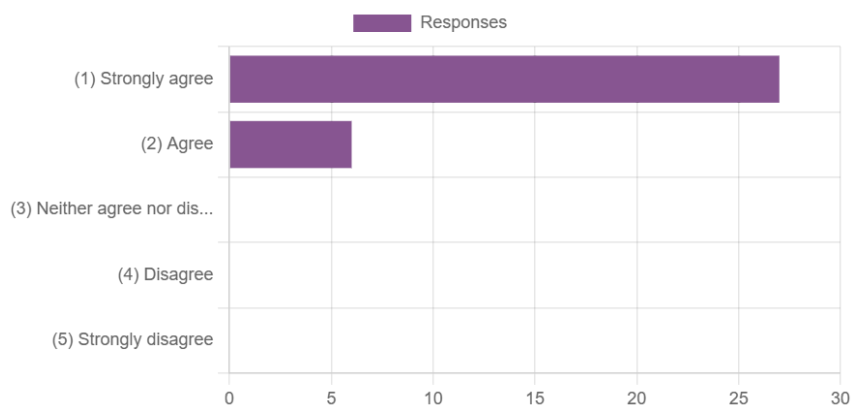

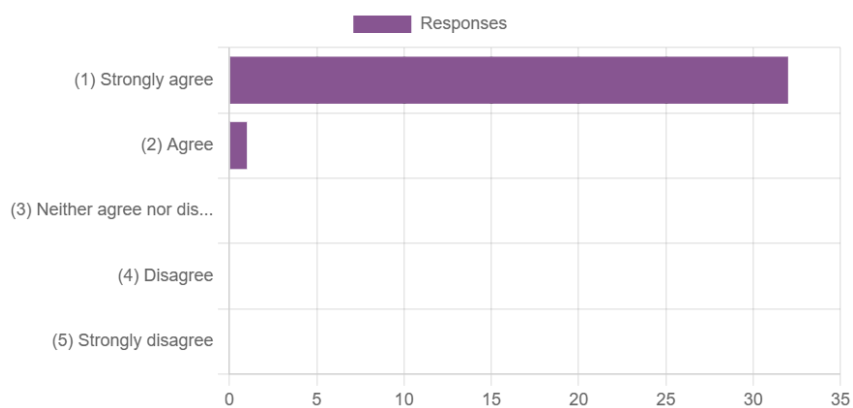

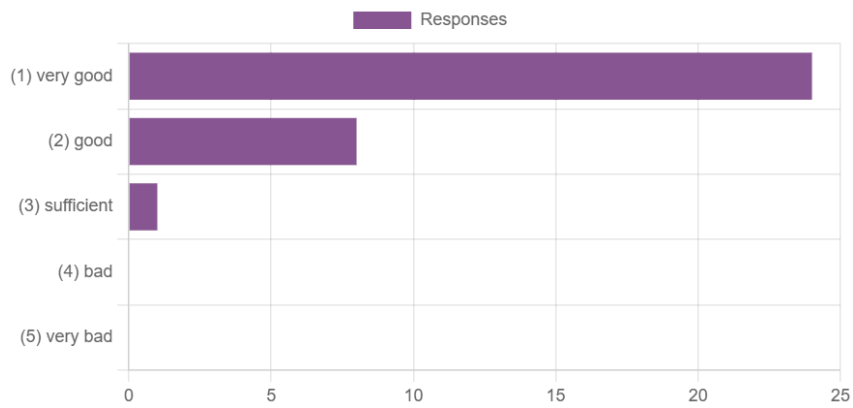

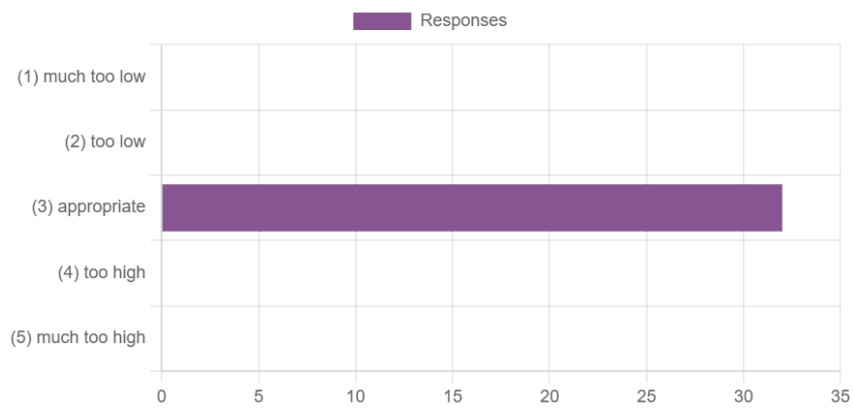

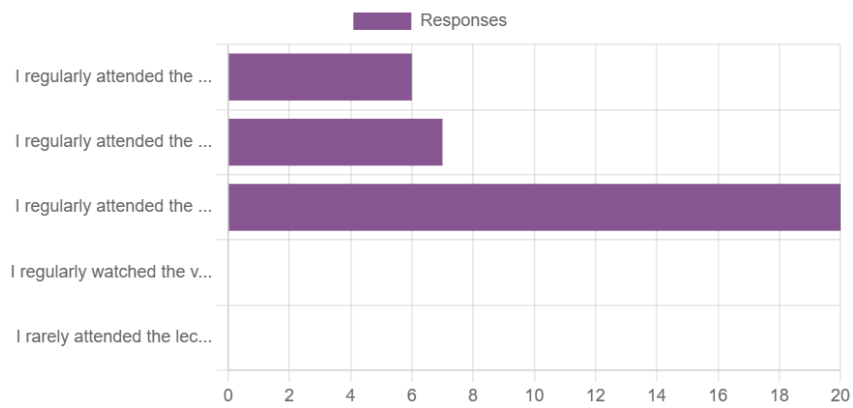
8. The lecture requirements with respect to contents and methods were...

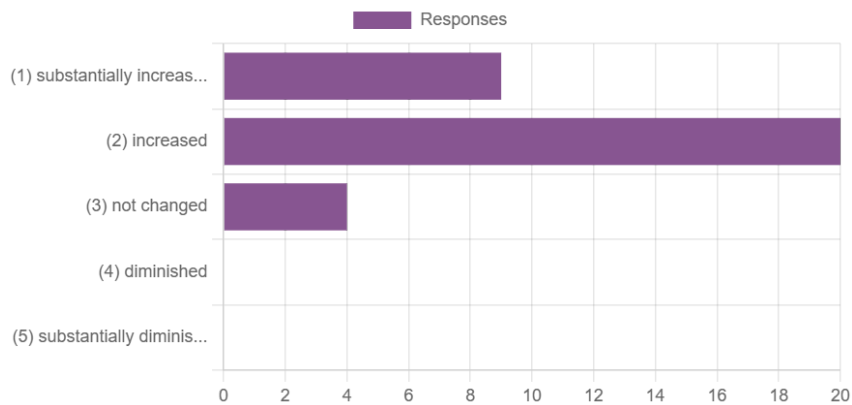

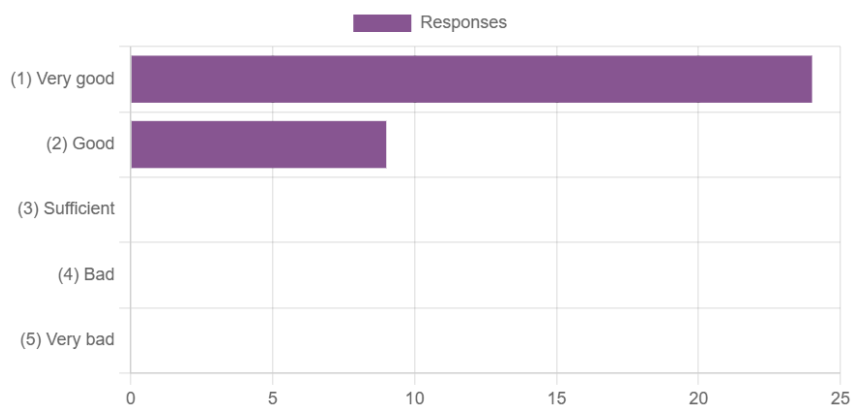
10. Due to the lecture, my interest in economics has...

13. What should be improved?

- A short visual recap (one slide or so) what we've learned so far
- Since I have an undergrad degree in Economics, I may have a biased opinion. However, I think that we can give students more autonomy. They are responsible for their own results and actions. I would have liked the course to be more challenging and more theoretical. Maybe even more discussions about current topics that would challenge the students to think on their own. I am a little worried that students only study for the exam, but do not fully grasp the idea and intention behind this extremely important topic, which is everywhere in our lives.
